



Attestation d'études professionnelles (AEP) for in-school Daycare Educator

Please refer to the Provincial Collective Agreement (S19) 2010 – 2015: Appendix XV Revision of the Classification Plan – 2.2 Transitional measures for the class of employment Position of Daycare Service Educator.

What is the AEP and why am I required to have it?

The *attestation d'études professionnelles* (AEP) is the vocational studies program requirement for all Daycare Service Educators as a result of the changes to the provincial classification plan.

The school year 2011-2012 was the beginning of the transition period for Daycare Service Educator employees of the Lester B. Pearson School Board.

- All regular part-time and full-time employees of the board who held a position as a Daycare Service Educator at the end of the 2010-2011 school year are deemed qualified.
- All employees who held a position under article 10-3.00 at the end of the 2010-2011 school year are deemed qualified.
- Temporary employees on the priority list must have had 900 hours of work as a Daycare Service Educator as of June 30, 2011 to be deemed qualified.
- Temporary employees, with less than 900 hours, are required to complete the AEP for Daycare Service Educators by June 30, 2014.

AEP courses have been offered by the school board, through Adult & Vocational Education (AVE), since the start of the transition period. Although two programs are currently taking place through AVE, it is uncertain if future programs will be offered as it is dependent on government funding.
